- Our popular Book-a-Librarian has been more popular than we could have ever imagined. Teachers and schools are booking time at our branches or in school almost daily. A HUGE shoutout to our youth services and systems programming teams for handling this essential service!

Finance Notes

• The budget benchmark for the end of April is that 33% of the budget should be spent. So far, 29% has been spent and we're on target to be within our estimated budget.

- The Library earned \$25,297.32 from Trust Indiana in April.
 - Included in the total interest earned is the Valpo Garden Donations, which earned \$752.69 in April.
- In April, the library received \$3,000 from the Valparaiso Tri Kappa Chapter to provide updated tablets for our youth services department.
- April saw the final installation of our new phone systems! With NITCO absorbing our fax lines, the library is anticipating an annual savings of around \$4,500!

Buildings, Grounds, and Technology

- The Kouts branch had a new 5-ton ac system installed for their meeting room. This is step one of the larger project that will begin in the fall.
- Hebron is preparing to start their HVAC project at the end of May. Staff are coming up with different plans to still have programs, even though Youth Services will need to be closed. We will be reaching out to the Hebron Parks Department.
- RLM Landscaping did spring clean up in Portage, Valpo, Kouts, and South Haven, laying down a fresh layer of mulch and making the grounds look fantastic.
- IT continues to configure the settings for our new patron computers. This is a very involved project so we are taking our time to make sure we do it right!
- We scheduled the meeting room AV equipment upgrade for June 5th and have started getting quotes to update the other meeting room AV equipment as well.
- We have updated our auto attendant voice message to help patrons adapt to the phone changes.
- We've had some issues with our TBS coin towers and credit card readers this month that took some time to resolve. Nathan created some documentation on how to clean our coin towers to help alleviate some of the issues with coin jams that cause the bulk of the errors we tend to have.

- Jesse, Stu, and Roger met with a fencing contractor to go over options for the South Haven Library Garden.
- Jesse met with the City of Portage to finalize the bid package for the Portage Library Garden.
- We had leaks at both Hebron and Valpo that have been linked to rotting or faulty windows. Jason is working with vendors on quotes for replacement or repair.
- The Rotary garden is in the process of being opened for the season with a fresh layer of mulch, decorations down, and the fog walk being turned on. People are already stopping by and are excited for this summer!
- Jesse met with the new Porter County Parks Department Director regarding surface options for the South Haven Library Garden. He had a wealth of information to assist in the selection of our wooded trail.
- Jason and Jesse met with landscapers regarding options for the South Haven Library Garden and space.
- Stephen, Jesse, Jason, and Monique moved shelving units in the youth department in Valpo to accommodate the DVD move to the second floor.
- Jesse met with Lance from Porter County's Emergency response team. They will be supplying the Library with two portable AC units, one from the County and one from the hospital to help keep Hebron cool while the new AC unit is installed. What amazing partners we have with Porter County Government!

- Our community engagement team's partnership with the Porter County Government's Health and Fitness Taskforce allowed us to highlight a number of PCPLS "healthy living" resources during the Wellness Committee's presentation at April's Porter County Commissioner meeting.
- Willow and Ashley met with the Porter County Community Parks Department on April 4th to define our partnership and brainstorm how we can grow together including brainstorming gardening events, storywalks, adult painting classes, and Camp FUNset 2023.
- The Marketing team, with the Hebron YS staff, had a fantastic time at the Hebron MS Science Night. Between the giant slingshot, the fun games, and the engaging staff, they were able to reach a lot of families who did not know all that the library could offer them. We look forward to attending again next year.
- Jesse had an excellent meeting with the Portage School District regarding the next steps in collaboration with PCPLS. This meeting led to speaking opportunities with their education foundation and more!
- Our Marketing Team began marketing audits at the branches. This process helps train the trainers on cohesive branding, our marketing style guide, and how these visual elements dovetail with library resource promotion and accessibility.
- Ashley Montelongo, PCPLS' System Programming Coordinator, participated as a panelist at the Indiana Library Federation North Regional Conference on Friday, April 14th. She represented PCPLS (and our innovative programming adaptations and community partnerships) in a session titled, "Programming in a Post-Covid World."
- Nina and Sarah Portage's Chamber Night. The event's theme was Minute to Win It. The library booth hosted Skee Ball and handed out fun prizes.
- We talked about the library and all of our upcoming summer fun with 1406 people at outreach events, including Portage Chamber Night, Hebron Middle School Science Night, Porter County Recyling's Earth Day Celebration, Valpo Parks' Active Kids Day, and the Portage YMCA's Healthy Kids Day.
- Jesse met with the Northwest Indiana Food Council team on partnerships including the stocking of our new seed libraries!
- Jesse and Willow attended the First Things First Early Learning Collaborative meeting at the Porter County Community Foundation. This essential program helps our newest patrons and young families as they navigate early childhood.
- Jesse attended an Indiana State Library webinar regarding censorship and new legislation.

Youth and Teen Services

• The Hebron branch has been having some amazing turnouts for its storytimes. We already have two days that we offer storytime, to accommodate patrons and to spread out the attendance. We have now added a Saturday storytime that happens every other week, to bring in patrons that can not make it in during the week and to give families more options for storytime days.

- Teen programs at the Hebron branch have been really building momentum in the past several months. We had several teens attend our How Money Works teen program and our teen paint-pouring workshop was a hit.
- The Hebron branch hosted its first T-Rex Tea Time. There was a story, some dancing, and, of course, tea and cupcakes. Everyone had a lot of fun, especially our special guest Ms. T-Rex.
- Attendance to the Mother Goose on the Loose program at the Kouts branch has been gaining a lot of momentum this past month. We have parents/guardians from Chesterton to Laporte bringing their children in for this amazing early literacy program. If the trend continues we will need to add a second day or another time to be able to accommodate the numbers we are seeing.
- For part of April and May, the Kouts branch will once again be partnering with the Kouts Elementary School to host the KES art show. This month's art is clay hanging sculptures of the elementary schoolers' pets. The art show itself will be held on the 16th of May, but already we have been getting many families coming in to admire these adorable works of art.
- The Valpo branch has moved the children's DVD collection upstairs to the Youth Services department. This was the last major step in the Youth Services collection shifting project. The team is now working on the final touches, such as labeling the shelves. It is looking great up there!
- Valpo team member, Kristin, has been working with our system programmers to develop Sensory Storytime, an inclusive program with activities that support children with sensory processing challenges. We offered this for the first time in April and received positive feedback from the attendees, who said they would come back next month.
- The Valparaiso branch was a host location for Spring Into the Arts again this year. The Youth Services Department is showcasing artwork from kindergarteners, and the branch was abuzz with people on opening day, April 22nd. The artwork adds such joyful and fun energy to the department!
- Portage hosted the Portage Township Schools Elementary art show. The Youth Services Department had many visitors throughout the month and a packed house during the open house on April 6.
- Portage hosted a successful Homeschool Hour where students engaged in poetry-based activities. We look forward to hosting more homeschool groups.
- South Haven hosted a Toddler Formal, the event was fun and popular among our youngest patrons.
- Amanda Koeppen and many creative team members started prepping decorations to promote Summer Reading in Portage and South Haven
- System Programming Coordinated an Every Child Ready to Read Training held at the Wheatfield Branch of the Jasper County Public Library System. We had 3 programmers, and 2 system programmers attend.
- Our Book a Librarian feature available through our website has been gaining a lot of momentum. We have had a range of offerings based on requests made by teachers in the community. System Programming has been able to coordinate, delegate, and fulfill

all requests that have been submitted. Some of our offerings were Hi-low Book tastings, Library Tours, and Lego clubs.

- Our Storytime in the Park partnership with the Portage Parks Department is gaining a steady increase in attendance.
- System Programming received donations for our Summer Reading Grand, Weekly, and Finisher prizes from Mcdonalds, Culvers, Family Express, Dairy Queen, Pizza Hut, Roots, Imagine Theater, and the Field Museum in Chicago.

Adult Services

- Both South County branches had their adult painting programs this month. Sarah MacMillan keeps finding fun and simple pictures for patrons to paint. This month it was a colorful tree in full Spring bloom. Everyone who comes to the program has a lot of fun and can not wait for the next one.
- The Valpo branch received a Legal Help Kiosk from the Indiana Bar Foundation. It is up and running in the Adult Services department, and will surely prove to be an invaluable resource for patrons seeking legal information and resources.
- Valpo team member, Allison, has started working on coordinating Summer Reading displays. One of the biggest projects, the Lord of the Rings stairwell display, is nearly finished. Our team members have been working diligently and we will see more finished displays by the end of May. Many team members that don't normally volunteer to do displays have stepped up and have been really enjoying the process. Staff have approached Allison and said that display work has added a much-needed pep to the work day!
- The Valparaiso branch is grateful for all of the help it receives from its network of volunteers. Kelleen, the branch's volunteer coordinator, onboarded 5 new volunteers in the month of April. Volunteers help with all sorts of tasks throughout the branch, such as shelving, shelf reading, Genealogy data entry, cleaning, craft preparation, and outdoor cleanup (picking up litter). We saw a total of 87.75 volunteer hours in the month of April!
- Portage staff began a shifting project in AV to obtain more room for DVDs
- We are seeing more tech one on one requests in Portage and South Haven lately, and inquiries into that service. This essential service provides that individual connection that our patrons have come to know and love.
- The system programming team visited OE for our monthly visit. This month was Bingo Night and both participants and OE staff won books that were donated to the library.
- Our much-requested Seed Library officially launched in a soft opening. The community enjoys being able to grab seeds on the go!

Technical Services

• Tech Services have been auditing and performing maintenance on our Penworthy kits. These popular children's activity kits cover a variety of topics such as nutrition, engineering, and measuring and complement a variety of curricula, whether for public, private, or homeschooling.

- Inge, Elizabeth, and Jackie attended a tour of Baker and Taylor's Momence warehouse. The tour provided a great behind-the-scenes glimpse at B&T's operations. This gave us a great introduction to some of the additional services that we are not currently taking advantage of that may allow us to automate some of the more routine TS workflows.
- Tech managers are spearheading a system-wide effort to better understand our staffing needs by auditing our workflows. We plan to use this information to develop some performance benchmarks as well as optimize staff allocation.
- PCPLS partnered with local Cub Scouts to help build our braille collection. The scouts raised \$425 which the library matched. These funds were to be specifically for braille-enabled picture and board books purchased from the National Braille Press. These unique volumes feature the illustrated version of the books with clear braille overlays creating a way for both sighted and visually impaired individuals to enjoy books together.
- After a much-needed weed of dated materials in Valpo's children's nonfiction last year, Elizabeth coordinated a large order of children's nonfiction to replenish our collection.

<u>Genealogy</u>

- Our team researched and delivered information to Alexandria Monroe Library about Zada Carr Williams using our Centennial booklet.
- The team has been hard at work merging donated materials into our vertical files. This work includes making photocopies of original newspaper articles from other, non-archived publications.
- Chris started gathering information for the next Valparaiso Magazine about local restaurants that are no longer here. She will partner with Kellen to write the article that so many enjoy reading!
- Chris and the team researched the first computer at the courthouse through newspaper accounts. The IT team at Porter County Government had reached out for assistance and were very grateful for the information received.
- The team was able to help Kevin at POCO Muse with a request.
- Kathy continues working on Miller family databases as well as obit books for Chesterton and LaPorte.
- Chris M. Continues working on the very interesting fire department books.


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- Mother Goose on the Loose is such a popular program. We have parents, grandparents, and guardians coming with their children.
