Horizon CD

<u> August 2023</u>

Overview

- August has been a challenging month as a result of the issues faced with the delivery service from the Indiana State Library. As a result of these delays, no interlibrary loan or Evergreen Indiana sharing items were able to be sent, and all materials we had already loaned out had no chance of coming back to us. Luckily for us, we have a robust internal collection and a quality collection development team that has allowed us to mitigate the inconvenience to our team. We also did small local deliveries to neighboring systems to ease the burden. All that being said, our physical circulation took a hit of 6%. While disappointing, it shows how essential the Evergreen Indiana consortium is to our patrons.
- While physical materials took a hit, electronics continued to grow and was up a cumulative 26% with ebooks being up 15% and eAudio up 38%.
- Use of the library as a gathering space continues to be strong, with meeting room usage
 and attendance being up. Additionally, our spaces continue to be adapted to be more
 welcoming and accommodate more folks working, studying, and relaxing at the library. A
 new teen area in Hebron and Valpo is in the works, and the Youth departments are
 getting new additions as well. Keep an eye out as we continue to adapt our spaces to
 meet the needs of our community.

The hope is that this will result in a more seamless procedure for our staff and a more rewarding experience for our volunteers.
- Missy and Riana from the Portage branch started training in the adult services department.
- Sarah and Tifani interviewed candidates for an assistant team lead position in North County.

Finance Notes

- The budget benchmark for the end of August is that 66.7% of the budget should be spent. So far, 63.5% has been spent and we're on target to be within our estimated budget.
- The Library earned \$36,266.88 from Trust Indiana in August.
 - Included in the total interest earned is the Valpo Garden Donations, which earned \$856.77 in August.
- The audit for 2021 concluded in August with no issues and the library was commended for its good recordkeeping.
- A new Paylocity benefits module is being added that will streamline our benefits and onboarding processes while giving staff more control over the process.

Buildings, Grounds, and Technology

- Jason has been collecting quotes for the replacement of the Valpo garage door. The
 door has some issues that resulted in water entering the building.
- Valpo had a fire exit door replaced to comply with the fire code.
- The Kouts branch had some leaking in the sprinkler room this month, but thanks to staff
 finding it right away, it didn't get worse and there was no damage done. The fix will be in
 place by the middle of September.
- The Hebron Library had the building power washed this month to give it a bit of a fresh shine. Next up will be painting!
- Kouts had some issues with bats getting into the building this month. Thankfully, staff
 were able to direct the visiting chiroptera to the exit. Jason had Guardian Pest Control
 come out and see if they could figure out how they were getting in and resolve the issue.
- The South County team has worked really hard on the weeding and shifting projects in both buildings over the past month. Books are no longer on the bottom shelves, making the collection more accessible to patrons.
- All branches are working on a genre relabeling project for the CD collection making the collection much more accessible and discoverable.
- The Valpo team made a lot of progress on its collection-shifting projects this month. We are very pleased to report that the adult nonfiction shifting project is complete! This challenging project involved shifting nonfiction books and physically moving shelf heights. There are no longer any adult nonfiction books on the bottom shelves, which makes these materials more accessible and appear a bit neater as well. The adult audiobook collection shift has also been completed. The audiobooks are now on the Adult Services side of the library, with the rest of the audiovisual collection. Next up on the Valpo team's to-do list is the Young Adult collection shift, which we cannot wait to start!
- The city of Portage is doing a city-wide art installation with sculptures by artist Martha Cares. The Portage branch received a sculpture of 3 bears that is currently placed outside the front doors with plans to move to the library garden when the garden is complete.
- Work on the South Haven garden has started, they began digging the paths and working on the drainage.
- Sarah worked with Budget Blinds to order new window treatments for the Portage meeting room. Installation will happen in September.
- Nathan has been working on setting up our new patron computers. We have an intern
 that is assisting him with this process as well. We're planning on rolling out the new
 computers in Valpo first starting in October.
- Videotec installed cameras at the South Haven branch to cover the garden area. After the installation, we noticed that there is still an uncovered area so we are working with Videotech to find a resolution.
- We are looking into a small sound system for the South Haven garden as well.

- Our new Incident Reporting system is currently being configured. This will allow us to have better communication system-wide for incident reports and be more responsive to difficult patron interactions and safety issues.
- ENA finished up our internet upgrade for Portage, South Haven, Kouts, and Hebron.
 We're currently working with them to set up a VPN for vendor access and enhanced security in our firewall.

- PCPLS worked with the Indiana Department of Health to have their Mobile Unit at both
 the Hebron and Kouts branches for free/low-cost COVID booster shots. They would like
 to come back again in the fall to offer flu vaccines.
- PCPLS once again participated in the Kouts Pork Fest. The new library van got all
 pigged up for the parade. Word is that PCPLS had the coolest float. A big thanks to all
 the library staff and the Programming/Outreach team. Everyone had a great time and
 the library booth was a big hit, reaching families from all over Porter County. We can't
 wait to do it again next year.
- The Hebron branch was very honored to be invited to be a part of the Indiana Dunes Tourism's video project. Photos were taken and a video was shot. We can't wait to see how it all turns out.
- Tiffani & Sandra, from the System Programming Team visited Aylesworth Elementary School on the 24th to teach a Kindergarten class about the joys of the public library! They read 3 books including 1 JUMBO book called "The Seals on the Bus".
- The System Programming Team created the new StoryWalk which was installed at the Butterfly Meadows in Valparaiso. The story, *Zachary and the Squirrel Bath*, was written by local author, Karen Hisaw.
- The System Programming Team announced all the Grand Prize Winners for the Summer Reading Program. This year's program was a HUGE success!
- On the 22nd, Willow & Sandra, from the Community Engagement Team held a booth at Camp Collaboration. This was our 2nd year attending and allowed our team to highlight the library's resources and events for the 0-3 age group. This was an event where other businesses and organizations could network.
- Ashley & Liz hosted a Library visit at the Opportunity Enterprize Respite House on the 31st, featuring the *Throwback Thursday Lego Club Night*. This program is part of our once-a-month visit partnership with OE.

Youth and Teen Services

- Monique met with Emily, Willow, and Ashley to discuss program expansion goals for the toddler age group. We are planning to introduce a toddler playgroup, a loosely structured program that would allow kids to learn, play, and interact with their peers in a no-pressure environment.
- Liz and Steven at the Valpo branch are now assisting Emily and Corine with storytime programs. Our goal is to offer additional Book Babies programs, to meet the high patron demand for this program.
- The Community Engagement team visited each library branch to discuss plans for the upcoming Fall Festival events. The teams shared ideas about activities and event station flows.
- Sarah, Tifani, and members from the system programming team to discuss North County successes during our Summer Reading program, and how we can make the program even better next year.
- The Hebron branch had a bit of a 'goodbye to summer' bash, complete with water balloons, prizes, and a visit from the notorious Bigfoot that was seen around town all this summer.
- The Hebron branch was happy to partner with the Porter County Parks Department this
 month. We were all very excited to learn about nocturnal animals that live in the area.
 We even got to make our very own lightning bug jar. It was all very illuminating.
- Hebron had their very popular Back to School Nerf Night this month. Teens and parents had a great time at the library competing to see who had better accuracy at the 'target range'.
- PCPLS was invited to the Hebron Back to School Carnival and the Kouts Back to School Night this month. Staff brought the fun with games and smiles. We were able to reach a lot of new families as well as reconnect with our regulars coming back from vacation. We were very happy to be invited back to both next year.

Adult Services

- Nikki at the Valpo branch presented her first program this August, Watercolor & Unwind. It was a huge success, with 27 attendees and glowing patron evaluations! Nikki has been working hard to train as a programmer for months, assisting Allison with our monthly Paint & Pour program. We're so excited that Nikki is leading her own painting program now!
- Allison, Monique, and Nikki at the Valpo branch have planned out what displays are going up for Fall Fest and have begun brainstorming the execution. The new display workflow for the branch has also been implemented and we already have more staff participating in the monthly displays than ever before!
- Allison at the Valpo branch worked with the IT department to update our meeting room cards. We introduced a new workflow at our most recent branch meeting, which involves indicating whether a patron requested the use of library technology (projector, smart tv,

- etc.), which will allow us to better prepare to help them when they arrive. This new workflow has improved communication for room setup dramatically.
- Amanda offered her popular sewing program in North County and met with Sarah on how to expand that program to meet the demand.
- Submissions for the Senior Art Fair in Portage started this month. We are always excited about this partnership that allows community members to showcase their art throughout the building.
- PCPLS and the Northwest Indiana Literacy Council partnered to have an Art Night at the Hebron branch. Sarah M. helped to facilitate a fun time for everyone to meet, socialize, and make some really cool art.

Collections

- Courier Service In late August, the state library decided to cancel its contract with Pillow Logistics. This contract had resulted in some unfortunate service disruptions for our patrons. During this time, the collections team did a great job tracking and communicating service failures to the state library in an effort to assist them in resolving this issue. Collections staff will continue to coordinate the transition as the state resumes its relationship with the previous courier company, NOW Courier.
- Evergreen conference Collections staff attended the Evergreen Indiana state
 conference in August, where the consortium's decision to adopt Aspen Discovery was
 announced. PCPLS staff had the opportunity to forecast some of the excellent features
 of this product and generate some excitement for the rest of the consortium, as well as
 make some valuable connections with other member libraries.
- Tablets PCPLS received a grant enabling us to purchase children's tablets. These
 tablets, one of which is programmed bilingually with Spanish and English, are preloaded
 with entertaining educational programs. The tablets were cataloged for in-house use and
 can be found at our Portage and Valparaiso branches.
- CDs The cataloging team has moved away from Dewey numbers for our music CDs, and is now using much more patron-friendly genre headings. Hebron and South Haven's partial retrofit has been completed, and the Portage branch is the current focus. We believe the genre headings will greatly improve the browsability of our audio collection.
- ECDI In August, Elizabeth joined the Evergreen Community Development Initiative (ECDI) as one of four representatives from the Evergreen Indiana Consortium. In her first month, Elizabeth has been able to contribute to testing an upcoming Evergreen update, during which she found and reported a new bug. Joining this committee will give our library a voice in the Evergreen community and enable us to help steer the development of Evergreen ILS.

<u>Genealogy</u>


- It was too hot outside for the kids to chalk the walk for Kouts Piggies and Crafts program, but they still got to make some very cute piggie pictures.
