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PCPLS & COVID-19

We started 2020 in one world and ended the year in a world that was completely changed.

PCPLS was a leader among libraries statewide for our service adaptations. PCPLS was the first institution in the State to install UV-C air filtration units and become the leading library to offer curbside services.

What mattered the most to us was serving our communities, and we could not have done it without the tremendous support from our staff, administration, community groups, and Board of Trustees members.



Our COVID-19 response

First library in the area to offer contact-free, curbside pickup for patron safety and convenience.

UV-C filtration units and plexiglass panels added to all branches to ensure the safety & health of staff and patrons.

Implementation of a Virtual Customer Service team to provide reference service, process library card applications, and answer patron questions.

Vast expansion of electronic databases, materials, and content services, including educational resources for students and families.

iPads loaned to Northwest Health Porter hospital to facilitate COVID-19 patients virtual family visits.

Library staff sewed masks for healthcare workers.

Finance





Technology

Technology Highlights

WIFI ACCESS FOR ALL

Expansion of wifi access points across all facilities, to allow socially distanced workspaces and access for patrons.

VIRTUAL MEETING SOLUTIONS

Patrons can check out Zoom rooms for work, school, and community group meetings. Our Zoom rooms are high capacity and available 24/7.

FOCUS ON INFRASTRUCTURE

Staff worked throughout the year to upgrade servers, switches, and other tech infrastructure to ensure that PCPLS assets are secure and safe.

CYBERSECURITY

Creation of a cybersecurity course for staff to ensure PCPLS and its data are safe and secure.




Circulation

Our patrons' needs for materials were higher in 2020 than ever before.

Students needed materials to supplement the electronic classroom curriculum. Workers needed access to research and information quickly. And everyone needed something to pass the time, whether it was a book, movie, or magazine.

Staff added over a million items to our collections in 2020 to meet these needs. Physical, digital, or streaming - we had what you needed.



Circulation Highlights

In March, we added 1.5 million electronic content items so patrons could enjoy library services and content from the safety of home.

Overall, electronic materials circulation was up 21%, and public computer use up 36%.

To meet the demands of patrons, we added 40% more items in 2020 than the prior year.

Over 1 million physical items, like books and DVDs, were circulated in 2020.

We added up to 50% more copies of the high-demand items from popular authors than in prior years.

Staff purchased over 2,000 patron-requested items.



FACILITY RENOVATIONS

All five branches will receive numerous upgrades to their facilities and infrastructure.

GROWING COLLECTIONS

Our electronic resources - ebooks, streaming movies, databases, and more - will continue to expand

COMMUNITY SPACES
